

Now that Purim has passed, it is time to gear up for the celebration of spring, of renewal, of freedom – the festival of Passover! This year, Passover begins on Monday, April 22, at night.

When I think about the theme of Passover – freedom, my attention turns toward the civilian hostages that Hamas took from Israel in October. As I write this, I realize that by the time you read this, the hostages may be released and the war with Hamas could be over. *Ken yehi ratzon* – may it come to pass that these words are irrelevant.

And just in case they aren't, I want to recommend that during any seder that you host or attend, include a chair for a hostage. Just as we have at Beth Israel – The West Temple, designate a chair for a hostage by wrapping it with a blue ribbon and setting a place at your table. As we recall how we were freed from slavery in Egypt by God's strong hand and God's outstretched arm, let's pray for freedom from captivity for the Israeli hostages and for peace between all the children of Abraham – those descended from Sarah and those descended from Hagar.

As we move into "The Season of Our Redemption", let's remember these words from A Prayer for Peace: "We have come into being to praise, to labor, and to love." May there be peace soon.

From time to time, Beth Israel - The West Temple updates our Constitution, which is our governing document. At the end of this fiscal year, at our Congregational meeting, I will ask our members to approve the following:

Standing Committees

The Board voted to approve adding a new standing committee,
 Communications. I would ask that the following description be added to our
 Constitution:

"The Communications Committee is responsible for temple communications, including the monthly Bulletin and weekly News You Can Use emails.

Communications also includes oversight of our website and social media. The Committee may also create surveys and gather information to help us better serve our congregants, and may also create marketing materials for potential new members."

Geralda Simko is our first Communications chairperson and board member.

Change of a committee name, from Building & Grounds to Facilities, to better
reflect the responsibilities of this important committee. The Facilities
Committee providers oversight for our physical building and grounds, or
course, but also now includes our computers, printer, cameras and security
systems.

Justin Morse is our Facilities chairperson and board member.

Code of Ethics

 The Board has approved a Code of Ethics, which was developed with assistance from the Union for Reform Judaism. The Code can be found our our website.

The board has voted to approve the inclusion of the following language to be added to our Constitution:

"Beth Israel - The West Temple has adopted a Code of Ethics, which provides broad and distinct guidelines for our clergy, staff, volunteers, members, and guests. The Board may amend the Code as needed, with approval from the Congregation. Reported violations of the Code will be reviewed by the Board. If the matter is determined to be relatively minor, the Board will seek to bring all parties to a fair and equitable resolution, including, but not limited to a review and reminder of our expectations of how we treat one another — with courtesy and respect, consistent with Jewish values. More serious matters may include the convening of an ad hoc committee by the President, which would also include at least two board members and one congregant. This committee would review the issue, and, if needed, would determine appropriate sanctions, such as the loss of employment, membership, or status as a volunteer. Any allegations that include criminal behavior of any kind will be reviewed by the Board (and clergy where appropriate) with both discretion and confidentiality. If the alleged violation is determined to be a criminal matter, it will be referred to the authorities, as appropriate, without delay."

We will vote to adopt these changes at our Congregational Meeting scheduled for June 9.

From the Educator



Asking questions is an essential part of raising children. Doing one's best to answer these questions is part of being a parent. Sometimes we are thrilled by these questions, and at other times we become uncomfortable, since we are unable to answer them. Whichever it is, we know how important it is for our children to keep on asking questions.

This month we will all be taking part in a Passover seder. The Torah, and the rabbis who created the seders, placed children's questions at the center of the celebration of the holiday. The "Four Questions" are designed to specifically engage children. Additionally, the purpose of much of what we do differently on this night is to encourage children to ask spontaneous questions. We cover and uncover the matzoh at strange moments. We hide the Afikomen, a piece of one of the matzahs on our seder plate, and we do odd things with unusual foods like dipping bitter herbs in a sweet mixture of chopped apples... and a green veggie (like parsley) in salt water.

The seder itself speaks of four different kinds of children with four different approaches to the Passover Seder: the wise, the wicked, the simple one, and the one who does not know how to ask. The essential point is that there are different kinds of children with different kinds of learning styles. The questions of each child come from the point where that child is in his own development. The goal is to address children where they are and lead them to a deeper understanding of their lives and the lives of their family and people.

Talk to your kids about the special heritage of the Passover story and the importance of asking questions.

During your Seders consider asking the following questions:

- What is your favorite part of the Passover holiday?
- How do you think the Passover story connects to your life today?




