A Reflection on the Past Year

As we wind our way to the end of my first year as Rabbi of Beth Israel – The West Temple, I reflect on what we did this year and how it went.

I love you all! You are warm, kind, and very forgiving of "newbie" mistakes. You are interesting and interested. Though we all come from different backgrounds and have different viewpoints and opinions about a variety of things, our passion for Judaism, the Jewish community, and Jewish life really connects us.

This has been an exceptionally hard year for anyone who is Jewish. Since October 7, we have been pummeled with news from the left and from the right. We hear from pro-Israel and pro-Palestine activists. We go to work and school with people who are angry about what is happening in Israel and Gaza – some of us felt unsafe at times wearing a kippah (yarmulka) or a Jewish star. And yet we persevere.

For many at Beth Israel -The West Temple, this has been a very different, if not hard, year, simply because your previous rabbi retired and a new rabbi began. I appreciate how gracious you have been toward me as the new person in the building. Over this past year, I have been impressed with the atmosphere of volunteerism at our temple. I am blown away by the people who plan, implement, and then clean up meals when we have meals together. I am blown away by our religious school teachers, who volunteer their expertise and their time. I am blown away by our board members and other volunteers who do what they do to keep Beth Israel – The West Temple running and to keep our building in good repair.

It is an incredible honor to serve as your rabbi.

This past year, as your rabbi, I was honored to be present and officiate at two baby namings, one bris, one bat mitzvah, one funeral, and to be present visiting people in their homes or the hospital as they recovered from illness or surgery. I am deeply honored that you trust me to be by your side during times of challenge and joy.

I have been honored to work with Walter Wright and the Board on visioning for the future. It has been a privilege to spend time with others who are not necessarily on the Board, but who are integral to our functioning as a healthy congregation: the people who come to Torah study, the people who show up on Zoom for Friday night services, and the people who join in for classes or book discussions.

I have also been honored to talk with many people who are considering Judaism as a path that might be right for them. Even during this difficult time in the Jewish world, there are many for whom our Jewish concepts of God and our Reform ideology are appealing and meaningful.

I am very excited to continue writing our Jewish story together! Over the coming months, it is my goal to speak with each of our members, to meet you, to get to know you – or get to know you better. I will be reaching out to get together for coffee, a walk, or even lunch if you are up for it.

Our tradition has a saying: "Kol Yisrael arayvim zeh bazeh – We are all mixed up with one another." I am so glad to be "mixed up" with you and so honored to be your Rabbi. Thank you for a great year!


