Shalom, friends. I've been thinking about wealth quite a bit recently. Look up "wealth" in a dictionary and you're likely to find definitions that fall into two categories: money and resources. For me, they're interrelated.

Welcome Back! I hope that everyone had an enjoyable and relaxing summer break. I, along with Rabbi Brown and your children's teachers look forward to another incredible school year!

Religious School begins on Sunday, September 15 at 10:00 am. We will kick off the new school year by having a special Havdalah service promptly at 10:00 am for all students, teachers and their families. If you have not already, please send in your registration and tuition by September 14.

This year our welcome back Congregational Picnic will be Sunday September 22 from 4-6:30 pm at the Clague Rd. Cabin in Westlake. Look for more information in the News You Can Use.

In October, we will begin our celebration of Rosh Hashanah, and ten days later, we will conclude the Days of Awe with Yom Kippur. Rosh Hashanah is more than the Jewish New Year. It opens a time to reflect on the quality of our relationships with friends and family, and then compare ourselves to the way we were the previous year. These High Holy Days – the Days of Awe – give us a chance to make amends, and then make a commitment to improving ourselves in the upcoming year.

As parents, it is a perfect opportunity to use the days preceding Rosh Hashanah (and on to Yom Kippur) to go through a process of both introspection and self-evaluation as a family. Thinking and talking about behaviors that affect our relationships with others with your own children may be hard. However, this may be a meaningful way to have open and honest conversations with your children, and to let them know that we all struggle with problems. The most important step is to recognize that if we transgress, we all have the ability to learn from our mistakes, apologize and make an effort to do better in the future.

Talk to your kids about: How can they improve their relationships with friends and family?

Connect to your children's lives by asking:

- What are ways we can be nicer to each other in our family?
- Do you treat your friends the way you would like to be treated?
- How does it feel to tell someone you are sorry for the way that you have treated him or her?

As we are about to begin the new school year and the new Jewish Year, I wish everyone a Shanah Tovah!

Dear Parents:

We hope that you have been having a wonderful summer! I, along with our new Rabbi Rachel Brown, and all our amazing and dedicated staff look forward to teaching your children this year.

The school year will begin Sunday, September 15. Classes will be held every Sunday from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm for students in grades K-12. The classes will be divided as follows: K/1 Grades 2&3 Grades 4&5 Grades 6 & 7 Grades 8-12(HS)

This year Tefillah and programming will be structured differently on the Sunday's when Rabbi Brown comes to the temple. Grades K-12 students will begin the morning promptly at 10:00-10:15 am with a short Havdalah service. Following this service, students in grades K-12 will have classes.

Rabbi will also be leading adult education classes from 10:15-11:15 am. The topics will include: a discussion of High Holidays, Jewish text study and the Talmud, and Interfaith Family Relationships. There will also be a book club discussion- the titles will be announced shortly.

The younger grades will meet with Rabbi Brown from 11:15 -11:30 am for a short song session. Grades 4-7 will have a Tefillah that focusses on both the morning prayers and Torah service Parents are always welcome and encouraged to attend both the Havdalah at the beginning of the morning and Tefillah with their children. The times for Tefillah will be announced each week in the Chai There!

Students in Grades 4-7 will have separate Hebrew language instruction on Sunday morning. In addition, Monday Hebrew for Grades 4-7 will offer several options for families.

Students in Grades in Grades 4 & 5 will meet in person at the temple from 6:30-7 pm. There will also be an online option for grades 4 & 5 during the week for those unable to attend in person.

Students in Grades 6& 7 will again meet online with Morah Shosh Ault, Monday evenings from 6:30-7 pm. She will also arrange a day and time for in person Hebrew for those students preparing for their Bar or Bat Mitzvahs and/or unable to meet Monday evening.

We appreciate the support from each one of our families for the Beth Israel-The West Temple Religious School. We look forward to another outstanding year full of engaging learning and growing!
