An Open Letter to Members of Beth Israel-The West Temple

Rabbi Brown

Dear Members of Beth Israel-The West Temple,

As I write this, it is a day after my son Gabe's bar mitzvah celebration. I want to thank you for your outpouring of warmth, love, and good wishes during this time in my family's life. I also want to share a little about my experience.

As a rabbi, I have facilitated many many students' travels through the bar- and bat-mitzvah process. Before becoming a rabbi, as a Jewish tutor, I worked with many more students. I can help *any* student – no matter their Jewish background or facility with Hebrew and Jewish prayer, no matter their learning differences – through the process, from learning prayers to writing their speeches to chanting from the Torah.

As a parent, my husband and I were unable to facilitate this for our own child and so we hired a tutor. He did for us what I like to think I do for students and their families – he reassured us. He took the burden of "making" my son practice off our shoulders. He validated all of our feelings when things got tough. He even told us that he was unable to facilitate preparation for his own child and had to hire a tutor when his child was going through the process.

As a parent planning the rest of the celebration – from housing for out-of-town guests, to sending invitations, to all the logistics of a party – we learned that these do not come instinctively to us. The party, though incredibly fun, was not what we would have planned had we been better at planning events.

I have a new respect for parents and families going through this process. Though I have years of experience, I was completely unprepared for the intensity of our emotions or the urgency of the logistics. I also was somewhat unprepared for how much three meals for our guests (Friday night, Saturday lunch, and Saturday night) would cost.

At the same time, I don't regret even one minute of it. My son's bar mitzvah celebration did what we needed it to do:

- 1. It taught my son that he can do hard things, that he can learn our Shabbat morning service well enough to lead at least parts of it, that he can write and deliver a *d'var Torah* speech, and that he can overcome all his demons and fears in order to do what he needs to do.
- 2. It showed me how important it is to spend time with family and to allow people some who I don't even know very well to shower you with love.
- 3. It showed me how important it is to accept help from others for tasks that are beyond me.

In our world, I feel that we are running, running, running so much of the time. I feel that we are pressured to be so independent, to do everything possible on our own. This bar mitzvah process taught me/reminded me of how important it is to appreciate the blessings in our lives and to allow "our people" – friends, congregants, even acquaintances – to hold us up and to support us.

When I was in Rabbinical School, one of my teachers used to say that 99.9% of Judaism is just showing up – showing up to help make the minyan, showing up to answer a question, showing up so that someone else doesn't have to be alone. I've known this and I try to show up for others. This time, people showed up for my family and me, and I learned how meaningful it is to have others just show up.

Thank you for supporting us during this chapter in our lives. Thank you for your emails, for showing up to services, for your kind wishes and blessings, for the blessings of your presence. As we move into the new year 2025, may these blessings return to you a thousand-fold!
