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When Adar Begins, Joy Increases

This year, the first day of March is also the first day of the Hebrew month Adar. Adar is the month during which Purim falls. Purim will be here in two weeks. Our Jewish tradition has a slogan that comes straight out of the Talmud: "When Adar begins, joy increases" (Babylonian Talmud, tractate Ta'anit, 29a).

But I'm not feeling very joyous this year. As I write this, the funeral for the Bibas family has just taken place. Politics in this country are a mess. The sky is grey. I'm just not feeling it. Usually Adar is my favorite month. I look forward to the hijinks and merriment of Purim all year. I think of funny practical jokes and fantasize about doing them during Adar. I carefully plan and make my costume

But this year is different. I just don't feel like it.

According to the translation of the Talmud by Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz, the Talmud actually says "Just as when Av begins one decreases rejoicing, so too when the month of Adar begins, one increases rejoicing."

The month of Av falls in the summer. The Nineth of Av is the day on which we remember the destruction and exile that took place against Jews since the destruction of the First Temple in 586 BCE: the destruction of the Second Temple; the expulsion from England in 1290, the expulsion from Spain in 1492. During the month of Av, it is traditional to behave as if we are mourning: no attending concerts or plays, no shaving (for men), no weddings. In traditionally observant Jewish communities, people don't swim or listen to music at all.

In the month of Av, we are supposed to act like we are in mourning.

Likewise, in the month of Adar, we are *supposed to act* like we are celebrating. So that's the key? It's action. We act like we are celebrating.

In the book of Esther (9:22), it says that the month of Adar was transformed from a time of mourning to a time of celebration. When we act like we are celebrating, we transform this time. We reach down deep inside ourselves and find the joy that is there – even if there isn't much, even if the celebrating is only for a short time.

Finding the joy, even just a little, even for a short time, will help us have hope for a future of light, hope for peace to finally come to the middle east, hope that every citizen of our country, every person on our planet, will have their needs met for decent housing, clothing, food, medical care, and education.

If you are as sad as me, I invite you to join me in looking deep inside and finding that sliver of joy. Opportunities to mourn will still be in abundance. But maybe we can dare to hope for, and work toward, a better future – one where our mourning is transformed into celebration.

In Chapter 9:22 of the Book of Esther it says the month was transformed for the Jews from one of grief to one of joy. In Masechet Ta'anit 29a, the rabbis of the Talmud say that "When the month of Adar enters, we increase in joy." From these two sources we learn that the general theme of the month of Adar is happiness.
