I Can't Wait to See You!

Rabbi Brown

In just a few days, May 2, 3, and 4, we'll mark a special moment in our shared journey—my official installation as your rabbi. While I've had the privilege of serving Beth Israel-The West Temple since the summer of 2023, this ritual our commitment to remain together and to build a life together. It's a declaration. A sacred promise. A covenant.

In many ways it feels like a wedding after dating seriously for a while. We've already built something real—we've celebrated *simchas/*joyful occasions, grieved losses, learned, prayed, wrestled with questions, and grown together. And now, we pause to say: "Yes. This matters. Let's continue to choose one another with intention and love."

Pirkei Avot/Ethics of our Ancestors, teaches: "Find yourself a teacher, acquire for yourself a friend, and judge every person favorably." This teaching has always resonated deeply with me—not just as a rabbi, but as a human being. In it, I hear a blueprint for sacred community.

Every person here carries a story, a history, a spiritual journey that is wholly their own. Some of us have grown up with rich Jewish lives; others are returning, exploring, or stepping into Jewish life for the first time. Some of us are rooted in Jewish identity by birth, others by choice, others by connection and love. Each person brings something precious. I strive to meet every person exactly where they are – in the capacity of teacher, friend, companion – however will serve a specific person best at any given moment.

To me, that's what it means to be a rabbi. To be present. To share and teach tradition with passion – and also to honor every person's lived experience and to understand the world from your perspective

This installation isn't just about me. It's about us. It's a chance to affirm the sacred partnership we've already begun and to envision what we can create together in the years ahead. How do we build a community where every person feels seen and valued? How do we deepen our connection to tradition while understanding that "tradition" might mean different things to different people?

I am excited to continue to explore answers to these questions (and more) together. I have faith—in this congregation, in the power of showing up for one another, and in the ancient wisdom that continues to speak to our modern hearts.

Thank you for welcoming me, challenging me, celebrating with me, and growing with me. I am honored to walk this path with you—as your rabbi, your teacher, and your friend.

Note: The teaching I've woven into this reflection comes from *Pirkei Avot* 1:6 — עֵשֵׂה לִךְ רַב, וּקְנֵה לִךְ חָבֵר, וַהֵוֵי דָן אֵת כָּל הָאָדָם לִכַף זִכוּת.

Asay I'cha rav, uk'nay I'cha chaver, v'ha'vay dan et kol ha'adam I'chaf zechut "Find yourself a teacher, acquire for yourself a friend, and judge every person favorably."

This teaching is a reminder that sacred community is built not only on learning, leadership, friendship, groundedness, and generous hearts. May we continue to grow together.




More events are coming up soon. On the weekend of May 2-3, we will have the official installation of Rabbi Rachel Brown. It will begin with a Congregational dinner on Friday (details are the News You Can Use newsletter), then the installation ceremony during the Shabbat morning service, followed by a Bagel Brunch. The festivities continue in the evening with a Mediterranean mocktail party at the Cove Community Center in Lakewood. At the party you will be able to view and purchase original local art, original prints, and other Judaica.

On May 30 we will be renaming our Sanctuary in memory of Ruth and Harold Friedman *z"I* with a special service and dinner. The naming of the Sanctuary is a way of thanking the Friedman family for the very generous donation they made to our 21<sup>st</sup> Century Renovation Campaign. More information about that event will be in future Newsletters.

You may have heard that we had some of our Torah scrolls repaired. Last year Rabbi Brown and I went through our Torah scrolls to see if there were any damaged letters. We found damage on all three of the large scrolls and had that confirmed by a R. Bec Richman, *sofer* (scribe) in Cleveland. One of the scrolls was repaired (just in time for Sam's Bar Mitzvah!), but the other two had extensive damage that would will be very expensive to repair. As a result we are in discussions with a congregation in Toledo that is closing about purchasing one of their scrolls instead.

You probably thought that the 21<sup>st</sup> Century renovations were now behind us. We thought so too, but then last fall, at the urging of Jim Hartnett, the Director of Community Security at the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, we submitted a Ohio Security Grant proposal to replace our 70 year-old Sanctuary windows. The new windows will be double-paned and use both energy-efficient "E-glass" as well as laminated safety glass (like what is used in car windshields). The new windows will also be more colorful. Here is an artist rendering of the current design. I think you will agree that the new windows will be transformative!



Since this was a pie-in-the-sky request, we also asked for major upgrades to our camera surveillance and keycard entry system. I did not think we had much of a chance: over 750 other non-profit organizations in Ohio submitted applications and only money to fund a small fraction of them. But in February we were awarded every shekel we asked for! So this summer we will be installing a new state-of-the-art keycard system, a "video doorbell" so that the office staff can more easily communicate with anyone who comes to the back door, and a new Al-enabled 180 degree camera on the front of the building.

Last month the students in Grades K-5 participated in an all-school program – a Mini Seder and Passover Cooking. Enjoy the pictures!
