Moments of Community and Celebration

Dear friends,

As we head toward fall and the new Jewish year, I want to take a moment to share some joyful milestones from this past spring and summer – of deep meaning and pride that reflect not only personal achievement but the strength and sacredness of our shared community.

In May, I had the deep honor of being installed as the rabbi of Beth Israel – The West Temple. Though I'd already been privileged to serve this community for a year and a half, our installation Shabbat was a powerful affirmation of our mutual commitment – to one another, to Jewish life, and to building a spiritual home where all are seen and valued. Thank you for the warmth, blessings, and holy energy you brought to that weekend.

Just a week later, I completed the 18Doors Rukin Rabbinic Fellowship, an eighteen-month journey with rabbis across North America focused on supporting interfaith couples and families with compassion, creativity, and Jewish depth. My biggest takeaway from this program is that we at Beth Israel-The West Temple are already doing this! Our BI-TWT canopy is so wide and open that we make room for every individual and family, no matter which demographics they match or how they found their way to us. It was heartening to spend time with colleagues working to become more welcoming – and to feel affirmed in what we already embody.

Also in May, I was awarded a Doctor of Divinity, honoris causa, from the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies, in recognition of 20 years in the rabbinate. This honor prompted deep reflection on the path that brought me here – on the people, places, and communities that have shaped me. I am profoundly grateful to be walking this path with you. The joy, depth, and partnership we share at BI-TWT renew and strengthen my calling every single day, with a sense of purpose I couldn't have predicted when I began this journey 26 years ago (six years of rabbinical school, 20 years since ordination).

It was also a joy to be part of this year's Tikkun Leil Shavuot, hosted by B'nai Jeshurun in Pepper Pike and co-sponsored by more than 20 Jewish congregations and organizations from across Greater Cleveland. It was a treat to see so many of our Temple members there, and I was honored to lead one of the evening's learning sessions. The night was full of Torah, connection, sacred community – and even good food! – and reminded me what a gift it is to be part of the greater Cleveland Jewish community.

Finally, as we move toward the High Holidays, I'm thrilled to share that our new mahzorim (High Holiday prayerbooks) have arrived! In late August and September, I'll be teaching a series of classes to help us get to know these new prayer books. They are beautiful. Every Hebrew word is transliterated, so even those who don't read Hebrew can follow along, and the translations and English readings are accessible and relevant to how we practice Judaism today.

Each of these moments – personal, professional, communal, and spiritual – has brought me a deep sense of gratitude and renewal. I'm so thankful for the journey we're on together. Thank you for your trust, your presence, and your partnership. As we move toward fall, and toward the new Jewish year 5786, I'm excited to continue this sacred journey with you.

Educator's Desk



The school year will begin Sunday, September 14. Classes will be held every Sunday for students in grades K-12. The classes will be divided as follows: PK/K Grades 1&2 Grades 3& 4 Grades 5& 6 Grades 7-12 will be in the teen group.

There will also be a free monthly Yad B' Yad preschool program for families with children ages 1-5. The dates for this program will be announced shortly.

This year, we are excited to offer Family Tefillah with Rabbi Brown for Grades PK-6 and their parents every Sunday from 9:00 am to 9:45 am. It's a wonderful opportunity to connect with your children and community. This will be followed by a bagel snack before classes begin at 10:00 am. Religious school classes for PK-12 will then be held from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Rabbi will also be leading adult education classes from 10:15-11:15 am. The topics will be announced in the upcoming weeks.

Students in Grades 3-6 will have separate Hebrew language instruction on Sunday morning. In addition, Monday Hebrew for Grades 3-6 will offer several options for families.

Students in Grades in Grades 3-6 will meet in person at the temple from 6:30-7 pm. There will also be an online option during the week for those unable to attend in person. Students preparing for a Bar or Bat Mitzvah will schedule a separate time to be tutored with Shosh Ault.



You may have heard that we had some of our Torah scrolls repaired. Last year Rabbi Brown and I went through our Torah scrolls to see if there were any damaged letters. We found damage on all three of the large scrolls and had that confirmed by a R. Bec Richman, *sofer* (scribe) in Cleveland. One of the scrolls was repaired (just in time for Sam's Bar Mitzvah!), but the other two had extensive damage that would will be very expensive to repair. As a result we are in discussions with a congregation in Toledo that is closing about purchasing one of their scrolls instead.

You probably thought that the 21st Century renovations were now behind us. We thought so too, but then last fall, at the urging of Jim Hartnett, the Director of Community Security at the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, we submitted a Ohio Security Grant proposal to replace our 70 year-old Sanctuary windows. The new windows will be double-paned and use both energy-efficient "E-glass" as well as laminated safety glass (like what is used in car windshields). The new windows will also be more colorful. Here is an artist rendering of the current design. I think you will agree that the new windows will be transformative!



Since this was a pie-in-the-sky request, we also asked for major upgrades to our camera surveillance and keycard entry system. I did not think we had much of a chance: over 750 other non-profit organizations in Ohio submitted applications and only money to fund a small fraction of them. But in February we were awarded every shekel we asked for! So this summer we will be installing a new state-of-the-art keycard system, a "video doorbell" so that the office staff can more easily communicate with anyone who comes to the back door, and a new Al-enabled 180 degree camera on the front of the building.


